Our charity this month: Under Tree Schools – Giving girls a future in South Sudan

As we go about our day, we can think of the school day of the girls of the UTS school in South Sudan. The 400 girls walk to school (no school runs by Mums) from the town that has grown up round the school. Some walk miles each day through the bush. Lessons take up the morning and cover much the same range of subjects as in England. The girls are taught in English. They have been having IT lessons on the school computers though these are now in need of replacement: nothing lasts very long in the climate of Malek Alel. The school day ends at lunchtime with a hot meal, with food supplied by the World Food Programme, and cooked by our four cooks. The school has an oven to make bread (cheaper to buy grain than buy bread itself). Once a month the food includes meat, sometimes from the school's cattle herd from which the girls learn animal husbandry. In the afternoons the 8 classrooms are empty; in recent years the teachers have been taking classes for adults, though these are currently in limbo as parents need to focus on making money to feed their families. At night the compound is lit by solar power: like the computers this needs refurbishment and UTS trustees await the time when the area will again be safe enough to be able to transport the spare parts to the school, www.undertreeschools.org

Bob & Jean Glover: Many will know of the deaths of Bob and Jean. Their funeral will be held at Mortlake Crematorium on Tuesday 26th February at 10.40am.

Women's World Day of Prayer: World Day of Prayer brings together people from all over the world to pray for justice, peace, freedom and mutual understanding. This years' service has been put together by the women of Slovenia (once part of Yugoslavia), and is an open invitation to all to come to God's table. Through the voices of mothers, girls, wives and grandmothers, Roma, migrant workers and refugees, we hear the story of Slovenia's political, social and economic history from its socialist-communist past to the present day. It is a service of music, singing and prayer. Its story holds up a mirror to all countries which have been torn apart by war and conquest, and the effect it has on the souls of those living through those times. Please do come on Friday 1st March at 4pm at St Mary's to this fascinating, moving service.

Ash Wednesday: Do come and start Lent with us at a special Ash Wednesday Communion service with Imposition of Ashes. The choir will sing movements from Faure's Requiem. The service, on 6th March, is at 8pm.
