Charity of the Month – FiSH Neighbourhood Care

This month's chosen charity is FiSH Neighbourhood care. Established over 53 years ago and was one of the first self-help organisations in the country. FiSH enables those who are particularly isolated living in our community to connect with trained volunteers through a befriending service.

Last year FiSH volunteers made 4,891 befriending visits and telephone calls. The quality time together helps to combat loneliness and improve wellbeing. Let us think of all those and are lonely and isolated living amongst us who FiSH is unaware of and hope that with your help new connections can be made.

FiSH are aiming to raise £50,000 to secure their future (please see their leaflet) and all the Trustees, including **Rev'd Richard Sewell**, will be undertaking 'Walking the Talk' sponsored walk in Richmond Park on Saturday 29th October. Please visit www.fishhelp.org.uk for sponsorship details.
